The Institute will make all the necessary efforts to involve the students, faculty and staff in "Green Campus Initiatives" by designating the exclusive volunteers of ECO Club, NSS and other student volunteers.

1. Clean Campus Initiatives

In compliance with the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and SDGs Goal [3], TBAKC will actively organise cleaning initiatives both on and off campus. By undertaking regularly scheduled cleanliness drives, the College will raise general awareness of cleanliness and hygiene among students and staff members.

The goal is to inspire them to make a proactive contribution. Such activities will fall under ECO club, NSS and MGNCRE as core activities. These cleanliness efforts will also be

2. Landscaping with Trees and Plants

The following actions will be done

Adding and caring for medicinal plants on a regular basis, using a composting pit to practise composting, using the created manure to sustain the plants, and incorporating students to raise awareness.

3. Ban on Use of Plastic

In tune with SDGs goal [11 & 12], our college practises single-use plastics including bottles, bags, spoons, straws, and cups are fully prohibited, and awareness is raised among staff and students through training sessions and noticeboards posted around the facility. The faculty and students are instructed to avoid using plastic water bottles and instead utilise steel or copper bottles.

4. Air Pollution Management

We adhere to green campus in our college in line with SDGs goal [13], For the purpose of preserving and conserving the environment and managing air pollution, the College will conduct awareness initiatives for staff, students, and the general public. Additionally, the College firmly forbids the use of any tobacco products "No Smoking, No Tobacco". Slogans and placards will be displayed in prominent places. It is illegal and strictly forbidden to use tobacco or other related substances on college property.

5. Solar Power Plant

6. Waste Management
